Summer camps, a new dental surgery, laryngological clinic – TOZ is becoming popular The Częstochowa branch of the headquarters, Social Security, the surgery or to private dentists

Society for the Health Protection of the Jewish Population in Poland, which is known for its extensive work in the provision of medical assistance to the wider spheres of the poor Jewish population, despite difficult conditions, does not stop its humanitarian activities.

In addition, TOZ has reopened its dental surgery, which is open from 10:00am to 2:00pm.

Dental checks on children are also carried out in schools. In June, 1,133 children were checked. Those with diseased teeth were sent for treatment either to the TOZ dental

Although the finance resources of Nessiut [Heb., Presidency] NOS are very limited, Jabotinsky is not ready to give up his political fight. The party must wait patiently and carry out its tasks, which contribute to intensifying Jewish political pressure on the mandate . authorities.
